Strategic report

The company is an intermediate holding company within the group of companies owned by Utilities of Australia Pty Limited as Trustee for the Utilities Trust of Australia, which is resident in Australia and other managed clients of Hastings Funds Management Limited. This strategic report covers a review of the business and a description of the principal risks and uncertainties facing the company.

Principal activities

The Company's principal activity during the year and for the foreseeable future is that of an intermediate holding company. Its principal subsidiaries are South East Water Limited ("SEWL") and South East Water (Finance) Limited ("SEWF") (see note 7).

Performance of the company during the financial year

The audited financial statements for the year ended 31 March 2017 are set out on pages 8 to 15. The profit on ordinary activities, after taxation, for the year was £8.0 million (2016: £0.7 million). The primary reason for the increase in profit was due to an increase in dividends received from its subsidiary.

During the year dividends totalling £8.0 million were paid (2016: £0.8 million).

Position of the business at the year end.

The Company is in a position of net assets and net current assets as at 31 March 2017.

Principal risks and uncertainties

The directors consider that liquidity risk is the principal risk facing the Company. The Company is financed by dividends paid by its subsidiary, South East Water Limited. The dividends are set at a level to ensure that interest payments are covered.

Our key financial performance indicators ("KPI") are dividends received and dividends paid during the year, which are as follows:

Dividend policy for the HDF Group is set by the Group's Board. The aim of the policy is to fund the group's payments of interest and expenses and to provide liquidity to the parent company.

Going concern

The directors have formed a judgement, at the time of approving the financial statements, that there is a reasonable expectation that the Company has adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future as it is financed by dividends received from its subsidiary company, South East Water Limited, and is in a position of net assets and net current assets as at 31 March 2017. For this reason the directors continue to adopt the going concern basis in preparing the financial statements.

1. Accounting policies

The principal accounting policies are summarised below. They have all been applied consistently throughout both this year and the preceding year.

Basis of preparation

South East Water (Holdings) Limited meets the definition of a qualifying entity under Financial Reporting Standard 101 (FRS 101) issued by the Financial Reporting Council.

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with FRS 101 'Reduced Disclosure Framework' and under the historical cost convention and the Companies Act 2006.

In accordance with FRS 101 *Reduced Disclosure Framework* group accounts have not been prepared since the Company is a wholly-owned subsidiary of HDF (UK) Holdings Limited, a company registered in England and Wales and which has prepared financial statements that consolidate the results of the Company.

Going concern

The directors have formed a judgement, at the time of approving the financial statements, that there is a reasonable expectation that the Company has adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future as it is financed by dividends received from its subsidiary company South East Water Limited and is in a position of net assets and net current assets as at 31 March 2017. For this reason the directors continue to adopt the going concern basis in preparing the financial statements.

Key Judgements

The preparation of financial statements requires the application of judgements by management which may affect the balances of assets and liabilities at the balance sheet date and income and expenditure for the year. The directors consider the recoverability of investments and intercompany receivables to be the key judgement and having assessed this at the year end consider these amounts to be recoverable.

Income from shares in group undertakings

Dividends from subsidiary undertakings are recognised in the financial year they are received.

Taxation

Current tax, including UK Corporation tax, is provided at amounts expected to be paid (or recovered) using tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the balance sheet date.

Dividends

Dividends are recognised as a distribution when paid.

Investments

Investments are recorded at historical cost. Where the directors are of the opinion that there has been impairment in the value of investments, the carrying amount of such investments is written down to the recoverable amount.

1. Accounting policies (continued)

Interest bearing loans and borrowings

All loans and borrowings are initially recognised at cost, being the fair value of the consideration received net of issue costs associated with the borrowing.

Interest-bearing loans and borrowings are subsequently measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method. Amortised cost is calculated by taking into account any issue costs, and any discount or premium on settlement.

Interest costs are expensed in the income statement as incurred.

Cash flow statement

As a wholly-owned subsidiary of HDF (UK) Holdings Limited, the Company has taken advantage of the exemption under FRS 101 *Reduced Disclosure Framework* not to provide a cash flow statement because the financial statements of HDF (UK) Holdings Limited include a consolidated cash flow statement and are publicly available.

2. Operating costs

The fees for the audit of the Company amounted to £1,700 (2016: £2,050) and were borne by South East Water Limited.

There were no employees of the Company during the current or prior year. No remuneration was paid to directors during the current or prior year in respect of services to the Company.

14. Parent company and ultimate controlling parties

The ultimate holding company and ultimate controlling party is Utilities of Australia Pty Ltd as Trustee for the Utilities Trust of Australia, which is resident in Australia.

The immediate parent company is Hastings Water (UK) Limited.

The smallest and largest group of companies into which results of the Company are consolidated is that headed by HDF (UK) Holdings Limited, a company which is incorporated in Great Britain and registered in England and Wales. The financial statements of HDF (UK) Holdings Limited may be obtained from the Company Secretary, Rocfort Road, Snodland, Kent ME6 5AH. During the year, one of the minority shareholders of HDF (UK) Holdings Ltd sold their shares which were acquired partly by an existing shareholder and partly by a new shareholder. This has had no impact on the ultimate controlling party of the group
